- The Command: Stop <u>Deceiving</u> Yourselves: 'Be Not / Do Not Be Deceived' 1 Cor. 6:9 ١.
 - The Greek (μή πλανάσθε) the Negative Particle μή Plus a Verb in the Present Α. Tense and Imperative Mood Which the Verb Translated 'Deceived' πλανάσθε; English Transliteration planasthe Means to <u>Stop</u> Doing Something That You Are Currently Doing = Quit Deceiving Yourselves
 - Believers Are **Personally Responsible** to Not Allow Themselves to Be 1. Deceived cf 1 Cor. 6:9; 15:33, Gal. 6:7; Eph. 5:6*; Col. 2:8; Heb. 3:13; James 2:15; 2 Pet. 3:17; 1 Jn. 3:7
 - Things Believers Are Either to Do, to Know or Beware of in Order to Protect 2. Themselves Against the Deception of Sin
 - 'Put off The Old Man' cf Eph. 4:22-24; Col. 3:9-10: The Old Man, e. The Sin Nature, The Flesh; We Put Off The Old Man By Knowing, Believing and Applying the Teaching of Rm. 6:6-23
 - The Putting off of The Old Man Begins with Knowing for a 1) Surety and Personally Acknowledging as True That Our Old Man Has Been Crucified with Christ cf Rm. 6:9
 - You Must Reckon / Consider / Count Yourself Indeed Dead to 2) The Sin Nature and Alive Unto God in Christ Jesus cf Rm. 6:11
 - This Is a Command Which Means You, Personally Are a) Responsible to Do the 'Reckoning', 'Considering', 'Counting'
 - The Use of the Present Tense Form of the Verb b) Expresses That You Will Need to 'Reckon', 'Consider', 'Count' Yourselves Dead to the Sin Nature on a Regular Repetitive Basis
 - The Meaning of (λογίζομαι); English Transliteration: c) "λογίζομαι (logizomai) reflects the act of believing or holding a particular view with regard to something as the result of logical reasoning. - 4) Do Not Continue Presenting <u>Parts</u> of Your Body cf Mt. 5:29- 30; Rm. 7:5; 1 Cor. 12:12; James 3:5-6 as <u>Instruments</u> of Unrighteousness to Sin (τῆ ἀμαρτία = te hamartia) = The Sin Person / Nature (i.e. Old Man) cf Col. 3:5
- 5) Make a <u>Resolute</u> <u>Decision</u> to Begin the Action of Presenting Yourself to God / Placing Yourself at God's Disposal Rm. 6:13^b
