

Words of Jesus from The Cross 'Woman, Behold your Son, Behold your Mother' Jn. 19:25-27

- I. <u>Two</u> Things The Words Spoken By Jesus From The Cross, Which Are Recorded In Jn. 19:26-27 Have In <u>Common</u> With The First And The Sayings Which Jesus Uttered From The Cross In Lk. 23:34, 42-43
 - A. The First Three Sayings Are Spoken With A View To Meeting The **Needs** Of **Others**
 - B. Jesus Focused On The Needs Of Others While He Was Suffering The Excruciating *Pain* Of *Crucifixion* cf Jn. 19:25
- II. The *Women* Who Were By The Cross of Jn. 19:25
 - A. There Is Not A Discrepancy In The <u>Number</u> Of Women Who Are Listed As Being By The Cross In Jn. 19:25 And The Number Of Women Who Are Listed As Being By The Cross In Mt. 27:56 And Mk. 15:40
 - 1. Matthew And Mark Reveal That There Were <u>Three</u> Women At The Cross Without Mary, The Mother Of Jesus Being Included of Mt. 27:55-56; Mk. 15:40
 - 2. The Number Of Women Who Are Listed As Being By The Cross In John 19:25 Is Not Three But *Four*
 - B. Four Of The Many Women Who Were At The Cross Are Specifically Identified
 - 1. *Mary*, The Mother Of Jesus of Mt. 1:16, 18, 20-25; Mk. 6:3; Lk. 1:39-44; 2:34
 - Jesus' Mother Mary's <u>Sister</u> (i.e. His maternal aunt) Possibly <u>Salome</u> The Wife Of Zebedee And The Mother Of James And John of Mt. 4:2; 10:2; Mt. 20:20-24; 27:56; Mk. 1:19-20; 3:17; 10:35-41; 15:40; 16:1; Lk. 5:10
 - 3. Mary The Wife Of <u>Clopas</u> And The Woman Who Probably Was The Mother Of **James** The **Less** And **Joseph** of Mt. 27:56; Mk. 15:40
 - 4. Mary <u>Magdalene</u> of Mt. 27:56-61; 28:1; Mk. 15:40, 47; 16:1, 9; Lk. 8:2; 24:10; Jn. 19:25; 20:1, 18
- III. The *Words* Of Jesus From The Cross of Jn. 19:26-27
 - A. To His *Mother* cf Jn. 19:26
 - Jesus Addresses Her Not As Mother But <u>Woman</u> The Translation Of The Greek Word (γύναι); English Transliteration gunai In The Vocative Case Which Was A Term Of Polite <u>Respect</u> And / Or <u>Tenderness</u> And <u>Affection</u> of Mt. 15:28; Lk. 13:12; Jn. 2:4; 4:21; 8:10; 20:13, 15

- a. The Use Of 'Woman' To Address His Mother Here And In Jn. 2:4,
 May Have Been To Manifest The <u>Change</u> Which Mary Would Have
 To Make From Her Mother-Son Relationship With Jesus To The
 <u>Savior Saved One</u> Relationship With Jesus
- In Order To Become A Part Of The Family Of God And Have Everlasting Life With God, A Person's Relationship Relative To Jesus Christ Must Change To A <u>Savior – Saved One</u> of Mt. 12:46-50; Mk. 3:31-35; Lk. 18:19-21; Jn. 6:40
- 2. "...Behold thy son...' The Son Does <u>Not</u> Refer To Jesus But To The <u>Disciple</u> Whom He Loved; Who Was The <u>Apostle</u> <u>John</u>
- 3. Jesus <u>Performed</u> His Duty To God The Father Without <u>Neglecting</u> To Fulfill His Responsibility, As A Son To His Mother
- B. To The <u>Disciple</u> Whom He Loved: 'Behold thy mother!'; With These Words And The Words, 'Behold Thy Son' Jesus Might Have Showing Us That A New <u>Spiritual</u>
 <u>Family-Bond</u> Is To Exist Among Believers

IV. What People Must Do With The Cross

- A. They Must <u>Come</u> To The Cross Of Jesus *To Be Saved Reconciled To God* cf Eph. 2:2q6; Col. 1:20, 22; 2:14
- B. Once A Person Has Come To The Cross And Trusted In The Lord Jesus Christ And His Death For Forgiveness Of Sin, He Is To *Never Forget* The Cross, But He Is Not To *Remain* At The Cross of Lk. 22:19-0; 1 Cor. 11:23-25
- C. Turn Their Eyes From Christ <u>Crucified</u> On The Cross To Christ As The <u>Savior</u> Who Has Been <u>Raised</u> From The Dead of Mt. 28:5-8; Mk. 16:1-6; Lk. 24:1-9; 2 Tim. 2:8
- D. Go <u>Tell</u> Others About Jesus Who <u>Died</u> Upon The Cross For Our Sins And Is *Risen* From The Dead of Mk. 16:7
