

The Fifth Saying of Jesus from the Cross 'I Thirst' Jn. 19:28-30

- I. When These Words Were Spoken from the Cross of Jn. 19:28
 - A. *'After this'* Does <u>Not</u> Refer to Jn. 19:25-27 and the Apostle John Being Instructed to Provide Care for the Mother of Jesus
 - B. 'After this' in Jn. 19:28 Refers to the End of the Three Hours Between Noon and 3:00 P.M., When Darkness Covered the Land and Jesus was <u>Bearing</u> Punishment and Penalty for Our Sins and the Sins of the World cf Jn. 19:28-29 with Mt. 27:45-46; Mk. 15:33-34; Lk. 23:44-45; 1 Pet. 1:18-19; 3:24; 1 Jn. 2:2
 - C. When He <u>Knew</u> All Thing Were <u>Accomplished</u> of Jn. 19:28; Jesus <u>Knowing All Things</u> Points to His <u>Omniscience and His <u>Deity</u> of Jn. 2:24-25 with 2 Chr. 6:30; Jn. 6:34; 13:1, 3, 11; 21:17</u>
 - The Words 'All Things' Are the Translation of The Greek Word (πας) English Transliteration pas The Word in This Context Expresses the Thought of "pert. to totality with focus on its individual components, each, every, any" A Greek-English Lexicon of the New Testament and Other Early Christian Literature; When the Word (πας) English Transliteration pas is Used as a Noun It Means Each One, in the Most Absolute Sense cf Mt. 11:27; Jn. 1:3; 3:35; Jn. 17:14; 21:7; 1 Cor. 2:10; 15:27, 28; Philipp. 2:14; 2 Tim. 2:10
 - 2. All Things in an Absolute Sense That Jesus as Messiah <u>Had</u> to Do and That The Scripture Foretold Would Be Done by Messiah to Make the Atonement That Would Forever Satisfy, Propitiate the Righteous Demands of God for Man's Sins Had Been Done and Nothing More needed to Be Done cf Jn. 17:4; Heb. 10:9-12, 14; 1 Jn. 2:1-2
- II. What He Said, 'I thirst' Might Have Two Senses in This Context
 - Literal Sense Denoting <u>Physical Desire</u> for Liquid cf Mt. 25:35, 37, 42; Jn. 4:13, 15;
 Rm. 12:20; 1 Cor. 4:11
 - B. Figurative Sense Denoting the Intense Heart-felt Desire for <u>God</u> and <u>Communion</u> with Him cf Mt. 5:6; Jn. 4:14-15; 7:37; 21:6; 22:17; Psalm 42:1-2; 63:1 143:6
- III. What He Was Given and Why He Received It After Having Previously Rejecting It
 - A. He Was Given *Vinegar* or *Sour Wine*; The Greek Word Is (ὄχος); English Transliteration ochos Denotes <u>Cheap</u>, <u>Poor</u> Quality Wine
 - B. Why Jesus Received the Sour Wine Now, When Had Rejected the Offer of Wine Earlier of Mtg. 27:33-34; Mk. 15:22-23
 - Jesus Would Not Drink Two Wines Offered to Him Earlier Because One Was Mixed with Gall and One Was Mixed with Myrrh of Mt. 27:33-34; Mk. 15:22-23

- 2. Jesus Received the Sour Wine Because He Was a Thirsty <u>Human Being</u> cf Mt. 8:25; Jn. 1:14; 4:6; 11:35; 1 Jn. 1:1-3; 1 Tim. 2:5; Heb. 2:17-18
- 3. Jesus Received the Sour Wine *after* He Had Finished Bearing the Sins of the World, to *Fulfill Prophecy* cf Jn. 19:28 cf Psalm 69:21
- IV. The Fulfillment of Prophecies Concerning Messiah by Jesus <u>Prove</u> He Is The Messiah and <u>Validate</u> His Claim to be The Son of God
 - A. Jesus Declared He Was The *Messiah* cf Jn. 4:25-26
 - B. When the Scientific Laws of *Mathematical Probability* Are Applied to Old Testament *Messianic Prophecies* and the Prophecies Which Jesus Fulfilled the Fact That He Is The Son of God Is *Incontrovertible*
 - C. Eight Prophecies <u>Fulfilled</u> by Jesus and the Mathematical <u>Probability</u> of One Person Fulfilling All of the Eight Prophecies
 - 1. The Messiah Will be Born in Bethlehem of Mich. 5:2 of Lk. 2:1-20; The Average Population of Bethlehem from the Time of Micah to the Present (1958) Divided by the Average Population of the Earth During the Same Time; Odds Estimated to be: 2.8 x 10⁵ or 1 in 12,500
 - A Messenger Will Prepare the Way for The Messiah of Mal. 3:1 of Jn. 1:23;
 Lk. 2:13-17; Odds Estimated to be: 1 in 1,000 or 1 x 10³
 - 3. The Messiah Will Enter Jerusalem As a King Riding on a Donkey cf Zech. 9:9 with Mt. 21:1-11; Mk. 11:1-11; Lk. 19:28-40; Jn. 12:12-19; Odds Estimated to be: 1 in 100 or 1 x 10²
 - 4. The Messiah Will be Betrayed by a Friend and Suffer Wounds in His Hands of Zech. 13:6 of Jn. 20:24-29 Odds Estimated to be 1 in 1,000 or 1 x 103
 - 5. The Messiah Will be Betrayed for 30 Pieces of Silver cf Zech. 11:12-13 cf Mt. 26:15, 27:3; Odds Estimated to be: 1 in 1,000 or 1 x 10³
 - 6. The Betrayal Money Will be Used to Purchase a Potter's Field cf Zech. 11: 12-13; with Mt. 27:3-8; Odds Estimated to be: 1 in 100,000 or 1 x 10⁵
 - 7. The Messiah Will Remain Silent While He is Afflicted cf Isa. 53:7 (One Man in How Many, When He is Oppressed and Afflicted, Though Innocent, Will Make No Defense of Himself?) Odds Estimated to be: 1 in 1,000 or 1 x 10³
 - 8. The Messiah Will Die Having His Hands and Feet Pierced cf Psalm 22:16 cf Mt. 27:35; Mk. 15:24; Lk. 23:33; Jn. 19:18; Odds Estimated to be:

 1 in 10,000 or 1 X 104

- 9. The Mathematical Probability of All Eight of These Prophecies Being Fulfilled Accidentally in the Life of One Person Assuming 88 Billion People Have Lived Since the Time of These Prophecies Is: 1 in 1017 or 1 in 100,000,000,000,000,000 or 1 in One Hundred Quadrillion
- 10. The Mathematical Probability of 16 of the Old Testament Prophecies Being Fulfilled Accidentally in the Life of One Person Assuming 88 Billion People Have Lived Since the Time of These Prophecies is: 1 in 10⁴⁵ or 1 in 145 Quattuordecillion
- D. Prophecies Concerning the <u>Resurrection</u> of The Messiah Were <u>Fulfilled</u> by Jesus cf Psalm 16:8-10 and Acts 2:2-32; 13:29-37; Psalm 110:1-2 and Acts 2:34-26; 1 Cor. 15:4 with Hosea 6:2; and Jonah 1:17 and Mt. 12:39-40; Lk. 22:29-30
- E. The Resurrection of Jesus From the Dead <u>Proves All</u> of His Claims, Including His Claim to be The Son of God and Thus God and His Claim That Any One Who Believes on Him Will Be Saved of Jn. 1:34; 5:17-18, 40; 6:35-59; 7:37-39; 8:58-59; 9:35-38; Jn. 10:29-36; 11:25-27; 14:6
