Formidable. Grievous, Rapacious (aggressively greedy), Ravenous, Savage, Vicious, Violent, Voracious (devouring); This Imagery Depicts False Teachers as Being: "bold, treacherous, vicious, plundering, greedy, harmful, deceitful, offering help in order to harm" (de Physiognomica 172
