- Joy and Happiness Are <u>Not</u> the <u>Same</u> and Must Not Be <u>Confused</u>
 - A. Happiness Is a Temporal, Subjective Emotional Feeling in Response to and <u>Dependent</u> on <u>External</u> Circumstances One Deems to be Good, Beneficial, Pleasurable cf Gen. 30:9-13; 2 Chr. 7:10; Psalm 128:2; Eccl. 4:16; Jer. 20:15 Jonah 4:6-7
 - B. Biblical Spiritual-Joy Abides <u>Permanently</u> and <u>Independently</u> of External Circumstances

- II. What Is Supernatural Biblical-Spiritual Joy
 - A. Supernatural Biblical-Spiritual Joy <u>Cannot</u> Be Fully <u>Explained</u> of 1 Pet. 1:8

"Whom (refers to Jesus Christ in verse 7) having, not seen, ye love; in Whom though now ye see Him not, yet believing, ye rejoice with joy unspeakable / inexpressible (NASB, ESV, NIV, NKJV) indescribable (NRSV) and full of glory." 1 Pet. 1:8

- 1. The Word *Unspeakable* (KJV) / *Inexpressible* (NASB, ESV, NIV, NKJV) *Indescribable* (NRSV) Is the Translation of the Greek Word ἀναεκλάλητος
