- a. Mary' Song Is <u>Poetic Language</u>
- b. The Form of Her Song Is **Synonymous** Hebrew **Parallelism**
- c. Synonymous Parallelism Means <u>Repetition</u> of the <u>Same</u> <u>Thought</u> Using Different Words to Express the <u>One</u> <u>Thought</u>
- d. The Repeating of the Thought <u>Links</u> Her Spirit <u>Rejoicing</u> with <u>Magnifying</u> the Lord Expressing that <u>Rejoicing</u> in the Lord <u>Magnifies</u> the Lord
- e. The Word 'Rejoices' / 'Has Rejoiced' Is the Translation of the Greek
 Verb (ἀγαλλιάω) English Transliteration agalliao to be <u>Extremely</u> Joyful, Intently Delighted

- f. The <u>Basis</u>, <u>Grounds</u>, <u>Foundation</u> for Mary's Exceedingly Great Delight in the Lord

3) The Many Great Things He Does FOR HER BENEFIT
